## Western Rural Round-up-

Week beginning 16th November 2009

1. Bogus callers this week in Mollington. Two men described as white, mid twenties with Irish accents knocked at the door of a local lady claiming to look for a fictitious address. Whilst she was distracted another male entered her kitchen and made off.
2. The incident I reported on last week in Malpas involving the robbery and firearm seizure is still ongoing. 3 men were bailed for further enquiries to their addresses in West Mercia.
3. Following concerns raised to us about speeding on Main Road Lower Kinnerton we presented evidence to Highways of our recording devices which showed there was a speeding problem there. Highways have now agreed to place 30 mph activated signs at this location in their Local Transport Plan. In relation to speeding we conducted speed enforcement here and reported two local residents for speeding. Further speed enforcement took place at Pulford and we did not detect any speeding offences.
4. Speed enforcement in Malpas this week. 2 motorists were reported for excessive speed with a further 7 motorists reported for speeding in Backford and Guilden Sutton.
5. Sightings please for an Audi A4 index number YE52EVL. This vehicle was seen acting suspiciously in Mollington in the early hours of Monday morning. Officers attended and checked out one of the occupants whilst another male made off from them.
6. Sightings please for a Citroen C4 index number BT06OVE. The occupant of this vehicle was to be wearing a white mask in Rowton at 6am on Saturday morning. The vehicle originates from Birmingham and this is a very unusual incident to be reported to us.
7. Information required please. The toilets in Farndon were damaged over the weekend with the 3 male offenders making off towards Holt. I would appreciate some names please and any information will be treated in the strictest confidence.
