## Western Rural Round-up-

1. We conducted a joint operation with Vosa and Trading Standards this week at Beeston Market in relation to unroadworthy vehicles and stolen property. We removed several vehicles that were unroadworthy and seized some for no insurance. Whilst we did not recover any stolen items we did stop over 100 vehicles and the feedback from the farming community was that the joint agency activity was well received. We will conduct further operations in the future.
2. We have been receiving reports of thefts of lead from a church in Thornton le Moors that is under renovation. If anyone has information as to who is committing these offences or sees any suspicious vehicles, then please report it to us.
3. On the same subject thieves stole lead from the roof of St Marys Church Dodleston. Nothing seen unfortunately but any suspicious vehicles please report them.
4. Reports this week of a man taking pictures of children near to the Ice Cream premises in Tattenhall. The vehicle is a Honda Civic index number RJ05UKA and we would request any sightings please.
5. Sightings please for a White Transit van bearing registration plates K600EPW. This is on false plates which were stolen from Thornton le Moors this week and then used in a drive off from a petrol station in Tarvin. 3 white males were involved with Irish accents.
6. A 20 year old man Elton man was charged with possession of cannabis and criminal damage following an incident at The Rigger pub on Thursday. He has been charged and is appearing at court in March 2010.
